Receptive-Expressive Emergent Language Scale-3 (REEL-3)

Overview

The Receptive-Expressive Emergent Language Scale-3 (REEL-3; Boach, Leagus, & Brown, 2008) is a 132-item checklist that uses reports by parents or caregivers to identify major receptive and expressive language problems in infants and toddlers up to 3 years of age. The REEL-3 includes two core subscales, Receptive Language and Expressive Language, and a supplementary subscale, Inventory of Vocabulary Words.
